May 5th: Report on class X Result Preparation

The result committee for tabulation of class X marks was formed by Sister Mary Shylaja on 5thMay 2021. According to CBSE guidelines, the committee consisted of 5 subject teachers and two external teachers Mrs. Ranjana Joshi and Mrs. Pratiksha Singh from Matrix Academy. The criteria for tabulation and moderation of marks were finalized by the committee members.

The following criteria were followed for tabulation and moderation of marks:

- *The best score out of two periodic test was considered and reduced to 10%
- *The 40 marks midterm test was reduced to 30%
- *The best score out of two prelims was considered and converted into 40%
- *The sum of 10%, 30% and 40% was to tallied out of 80 as the final marks
- *The average of each subject was compared with the reference year.
- *The average of the subject was aligned with the reference year by increasing and decreasing the marks based on internal assessments and difference in the marks of offline and online exams

The final prepared mark sheet of each subject was checked and verified by the committee members on 24th June and uploaded on the CBSE website.

Extremely severe cyclonic storm Tauktae was a powerful, deadly and damaging tropical cyclone in the Arabian Sea that became the strongest tropical cyclone made its landfall in Gujarat. A number of districts in Maharashtra were affected by the deadly Cyclone Tauktae and Vasai was one among it. We cyclone hit the place very badly with heavy wind of 170 kms per hour. Even before making landfall, Taukae caused a trail of destruction and the storm contributed to two deaths in Vasai, destroyed hundreds of house tops and houses, caused power outages and large number of tree fall. We did not have electricity and drinking water for four days.
